Balancing Economy & Environment

Blue Prosperity partners engage in a multi-year partnership with Governments to develop and implement 20-30% marine protection and establish a Blue Prosperity plan.



Marine Spatial Planning (MSP)

A holistic approach that uses spatial information about natural resources and human uses to develop a comprehensive management system.



Blue Economy

Sustainable use of ocean resources for economic growth, improved livelihoods and jobs, and ecosystem health.



Marine Protected Areas (MPAs)

A place in the ocean where human activities are limited. The most effective Marine Protected Areas prohibit all extractive use (fishing, mining, etc.).

Blue Prosperity Coalition Government Partners

Working to establish 20-30% protection of their total ocean space while sustainably building their Blue Economy



Noo Raajje Expedition


The first expedition, led by the Waitt Institute, the Maldives Marine Research Institute, the 100 Island Challenge from Scripps Institution of Oceanography, and members of the Ministry of Fisheries, IUCN, and scientists, surveyed the health of coral reef habitats and fish populations across the Northern and Southern atolls.

- 16 Atolls Surveyed
- 978 Scientific Dives
- Studied coral reef composition & health, fish populations, water quality, and benthic communities.



Noo Raajje MSP

The process seeks to create a sustainable marine spatial plan that protects ecologically significant areas, reduces conflict among user groups, zones activities where they will have the greatest benefits with minimal negative impacts, and ensures that future development is considered in a holistic and sustainable manner



Stakeholders are given an opportunity to provide feedback on draft plan

Governance Committee will be responsible for putting a final plan forward for legal adoption

Noo Raajje Legal

An evaluation of Maldive's laws and institutions to support the design and implementation of comprehensive marine spatial planning and blue economy process. Two local experts have been recruited to work alongside our

inhouse legal experts.



Noo Raajje Program Governance

The governance approach for Noo Raajje program management, oversight, implementation, accountability, and workflow as it relates to the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signed by the Government of the Republic of the Maldives ("Government of the Maldives") and the Blue Prosperity Coalition.

It identifies four levels of engagement: Principals (high-level supervision), Program Oversight (high-level management), Technical Support (technical input), and Program Administration (planning and implementation).

Governance Committee Responsibilities

- Attend Governance Committee meetings
- Act as Ambassadors and Liaisons for Noo Raajje
- Provides final approval for actions that lead to program objectives throughout the MSP, fisheries management and Blue Economy development processes
- Identifies technical experts from Government, NGO, and private sector to serve on the Steering Committee
- Review policy pathways for implementing sustainable ocean management in the Maldives
- Agree on a final Marine Spatial Plan (MSP) & policy pathway to make a comprehensive MSP legally enforceable


Steering Committee Responsibilities

- Attends Steering Committee meetings and keeps represented Ministries informed
- Provides technical input and guidance to the Government Committee throughout the marine spatial planning, fisheries management and blue economy planning processes
- Reviews draft policies and acts as a peer review platform
- Sends a final plan forward to the Government Committee to adopt

Membership

- Governance, Steering and Sub Committee members are there as representatives of their organization and not as individuals.
- Membership is transferable to another individual of the same organization provided the new member's participation is approved by Co-Chairs
 - Members are appointed for the duration of the program and involvement is voluntary

Decision Making




Program Administration will make decisions in accordance with the Work Plan

For decisions outside the annual Work Plan, Program Leaders shall make decisions Including whether a decision should be elevated to the Principals.

Stakeholders with expertise in ocean use and management will make decisions as Part of the Steering Committee.

Voting




Where consensus cannot be reached, the decision will be subject to a vote

Before voting, a motion will be introduced and a discussion will follow, led by the chair or co-chairs.

Voting Continued

- A quorum of 51% members must be present. When a quorum is not present, the Motion may be referred to electronic ballot.
- A motion will be adopted by majority vote
- In the case that a member cannot attend a meeting, their vote may be taken by the Proxy i.e. a Chair approved representative from the same organisation
- Each organization had just one vote
